

**The 95th anniversary of August 30 Victory Day, which constitutes an important milestone in our nation's struggle for independence and is celebrated with pride every year, is witnessing a meaningful event**

**A magnificent Turkish flag covering an area of 2400 square meters has been hoisted on the 30-storey High Houses block of the İncek Loft project, where it can be seen from many parts of Ankara.**

Prepared by professional teams, the giant Turkish flag, which took shape by bringing together pieces measuring 3 meters 20 centimeters, weighs 300 kilograms.
